What is an urban environment?

<p>Create a 3D model of your favourite plant or flower.</p> <p>Label the key parts of the plant, e.g. the roots, stem, leaves, petal, stamen, carpel.</p>	<p>Carry out a traffic survey.</p> <p>What vehicles did you see? Keep a tally of what you see, then present your data in a bar graph. Which type of vehicle did you see the most? Which did you see the least?</p>
<p>Imagine you are the Prime Minister of the UK.</p> <p>What would you change? How would you run the country? What rules would you want people to follow?</p>	<p>Create a sketch of a local landscape.</p> <p>What are the human and physical features?</p>
<p>Design an imaginary town.</p> <p>Make a map to show how it is planned out and what features it has. Don't forget to include a key.</p>	<p>Carry out your own research on Banksy</p>

The home learning grid gives a variety of creative tasks for the children to choose from, which link to their topic for the term. We suggest that children choose one to complete, however should they wish to complete more, we recommend no more than three. These tasks are optional and should be chosen in addition to, not instead of, the English and Maths key learning tasks.
