Research a significant human or physical aspect of Brazil that interests you.	Imagine you find yourself lost in the Amazon rainforest. You only have 5 things in your backpack	Choose one animal that lives in the Amazon Rainforest.

Design and create a model of Christ the Redeemer statue.	Write a poem about Brazil. The type of poem is your choice. How will you include a range of figurative language in your writing?	Find a Brazilian recipe that is enjoyed by the people of Brazil.  Maybe you could even try it yourself!
Write a description of a journey you might make in a helicopter above the Amazon rainforest.	Learn some words or common phrases in Portuguese.	Create a model or diagram showing the different layers of the rainforest.
What can you see? How do you feel?  How could you include key Y5 SPaG skills?	You could create a mini translation book to share in class.	You could add facts about each layer to your design.
