

EYFS Term 3 Home Learning Grid
Does everything go to sleep at night?

Make puppets of animals that are nocturnal (like owls, foxes, and bats) and diurnal (like squirrels, dogs, and chickens) using paper bags or socks.	Have a look at the night sky before bed. Can you sing Twinkle Twinkle while you watch the stars?	Make a nest for a baby owl. What could you use? (Take a photo and pop it in your homework book)
Create pretend fireflies with glow-in-the-dark stickers on clear jars to represent animals that stay awake at night.	Make an owl mask and go on a night time animal hunt indoors, looking for toys or stuffed animals hiding in shadows.	Draw and label a night time picture, which animals will you include?
Set up a torch or spotlight and create shadow shapes, experimenting with how things look in the dark.	Make a star mobile using cutouts of stars, hanging them on a hanger or paper plate to create a sleepy sky.	Cut out pictures of things seen during the day (like sunshine, flowers, birds) and at night (like stars, the moon, and owls) sort them out.

The home learning grid gives a variety of creative tasks for the children to choose from, which link to their topic for the term. We suggest that children choose one to complete, however should they wish to complete more, we recommend no more than three. These tasks are optional and should be chosen in addition to, not instead of, the English and Maths key learning tasks.
