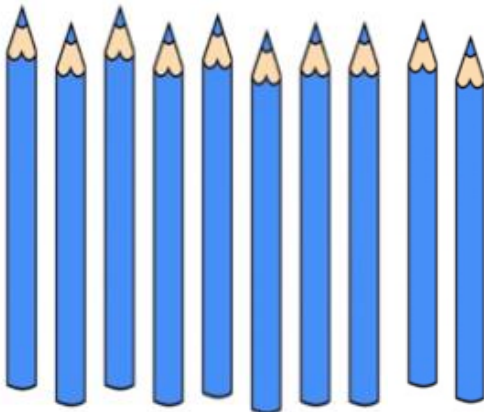
Reception– Spring 1
