Year 1 – Spring 1

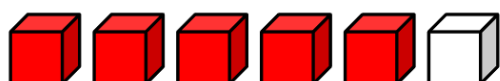
I know the composition of the numbers 6 to 10 as '5 and a bit'

By the end of this half term, children should feel confident when recognising the number of objects in a group of between 6 and 10 objects without counting them one at a time.

Key Vocabulary

6 is made of 5 and 1.

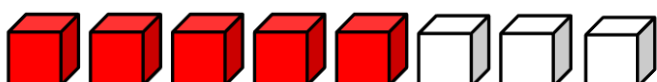
5 and 2 make 7.



$$6 = 5 + 1$$



$$7 = 5 + 2$$



$$8 = 5 + 3$$



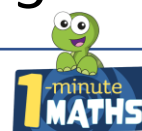
$$9 = 5 + 4$$



$$10 = 5 + 5$$

Practise online:

Practical idea:

Fingers are an excellent model for exploring the 'five and a bit' structure at home.

Grow it – practise counting out a given number between 6 and 10, one finger at a time.

Show it – open the correct number of fingers to show a given number without counting.

Throw it – for a given number, open the correct number of fingers without looking (hands behind back) then reveal.
