- ...AWAKENS children to the world around them.

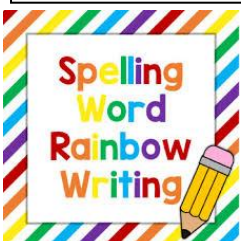
